The *onWORD* series is a free, weekly journey through scripture, exploring the books, themes, people and places of the Bible. The current series is on 'Wisdom Literature' (Job, Ecclesiastes, Proverbs, Song of Songs, etc.), and we invite you to join us for a two-week exploration of wisdom in Proverbs 7 – a study that will be of special interest to women.



February 2 and 9, popular author and speaker Mary Kassian will discuss wise and foolish women as they are compared in Proverbs 7. It's a compelling study of 21 points of contrast, helping you discern the difference between wild and wise. Are you are living as a wise person, or have you bought into the lifestyle our culture holds as ideal? Join us for these discussions!

The Wisdom Series will end February 16, as Dr. Jerry Shepherd of Taylor Seminary looks at how Jesus Christ is the embodiment of the wisdom of God, as depicted in the poems, songs, discourses, proverbs and laments of the Old Testament. *(Another series will begin February 23rd.)*

Mary Kassian is an award winning author, internationally renowned speaker, and a distinguished professor at Southern Baptist Seminary; she is the author of several Lifeway Bible Studies, and has just written a soon-to-be-published book called *Girls Gone Wise in a World Gone Wild*. She and her husband Brent have mastered the art of cheering after spending countless hours watching their sons play ice hockey and volleyball.
