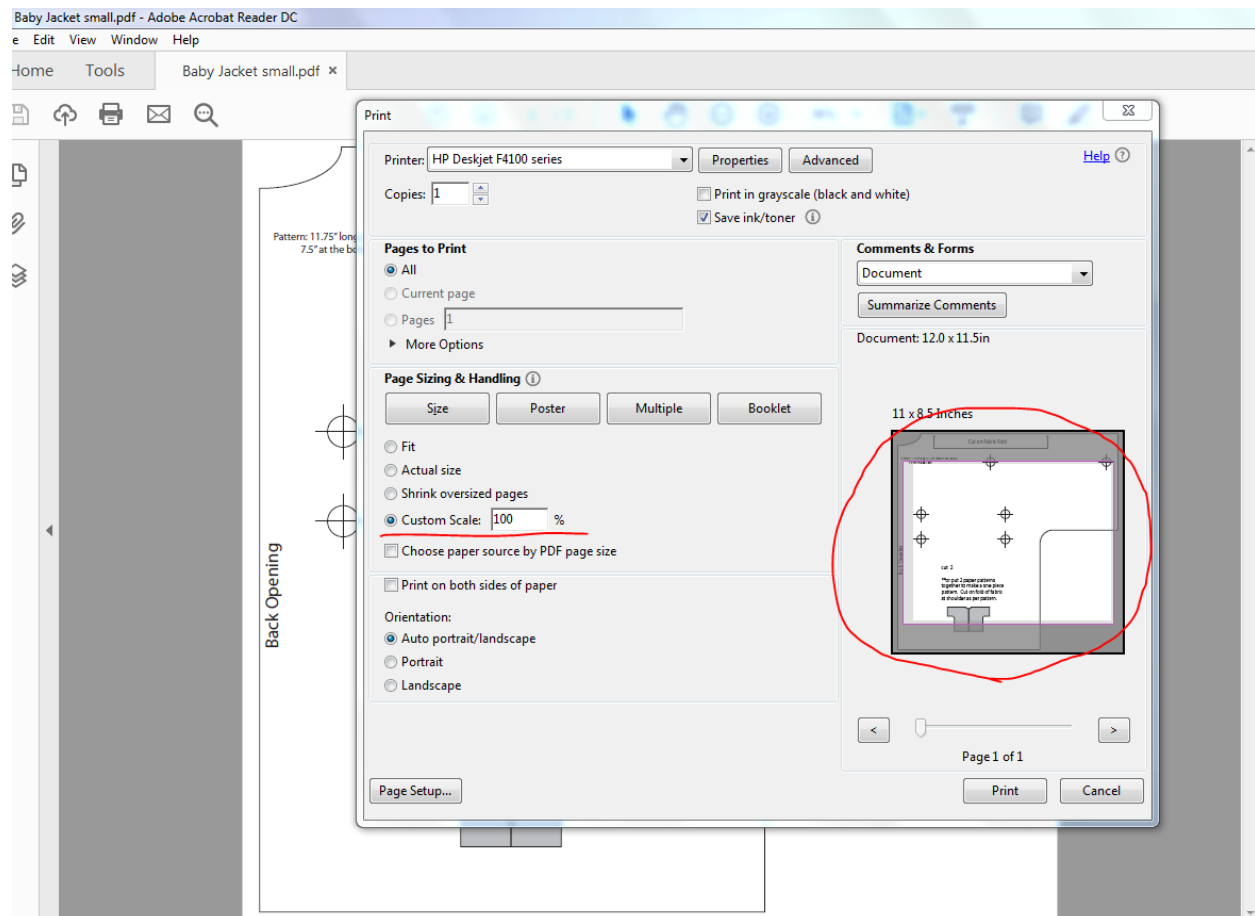


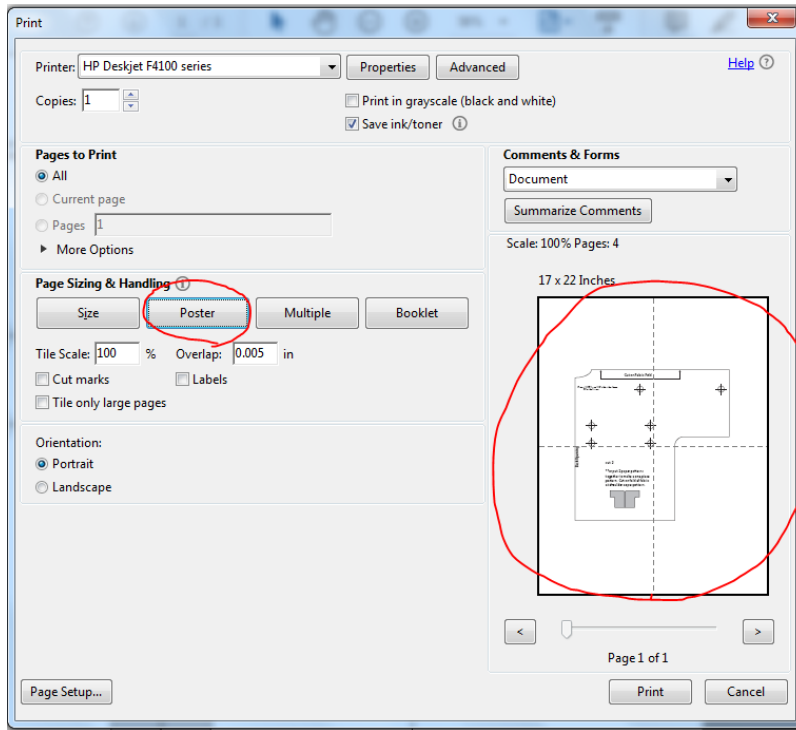
Step-by-Step Guide for Printing Sewing Patterns

To print the sewing patterns for the baby jacket (small and large sizes) in their actual size, you need to adjust your print settings. Below is one of the ways you can print the pattern in 4 sheets of letter-size (8.5 x 11 Inches) papers.

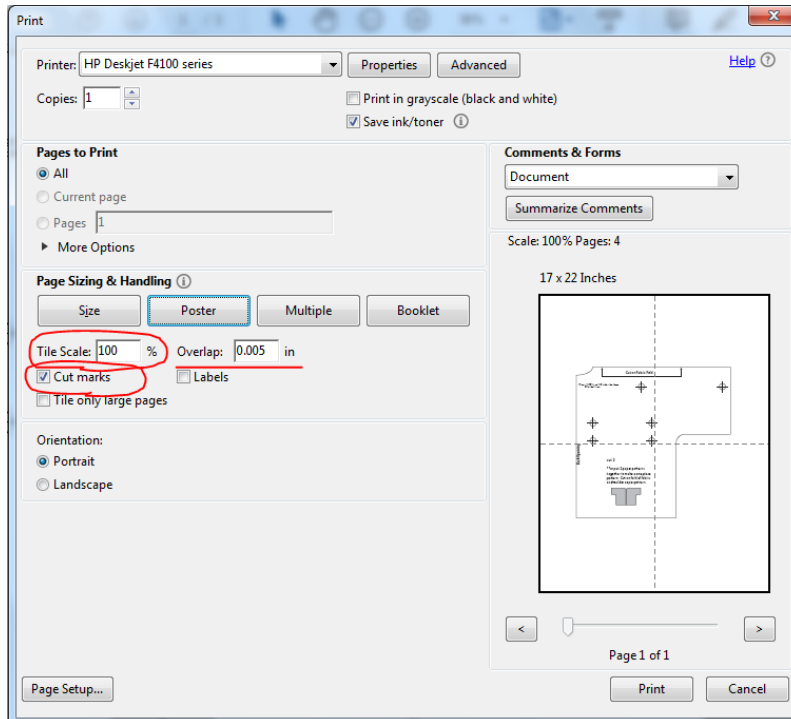
1. Open the sewing pattern in pdf, then open “print” window. The pattern is too large to fit in a sheet of 8.5” x 11” paper.



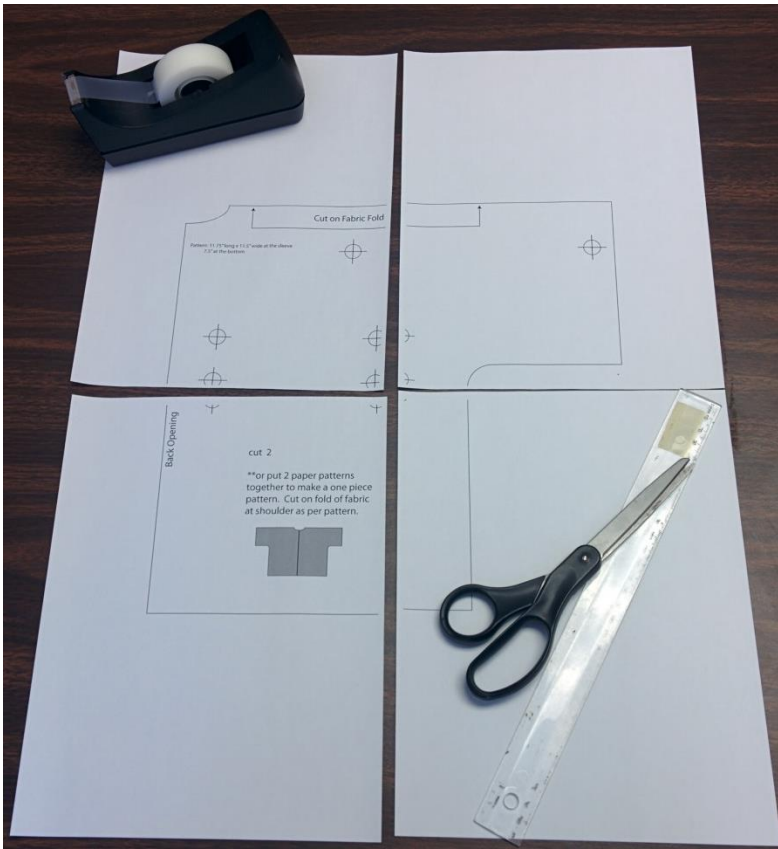
- Under “Page Sizing & Handling,” Press the “Poster” button. You will see a preview like this:



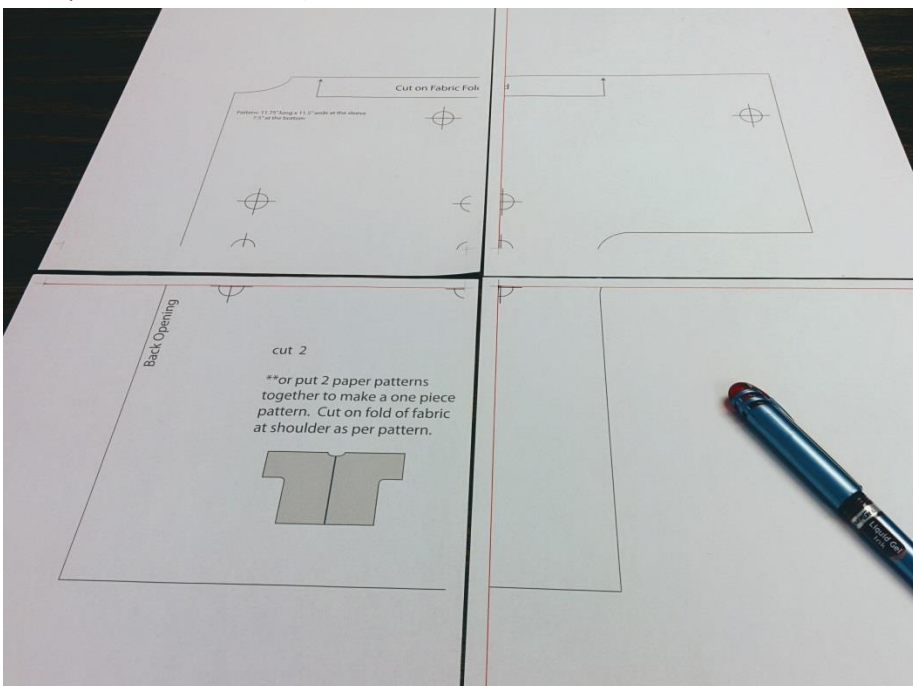
- Make sure the “Tile scale” is 100%.
- Check the box for “Cut marks,” which prints lines to indicate where to trim the sheet.
- “Overlap” is margin to glue/tape the sheets together. Adjust the space as you wish.



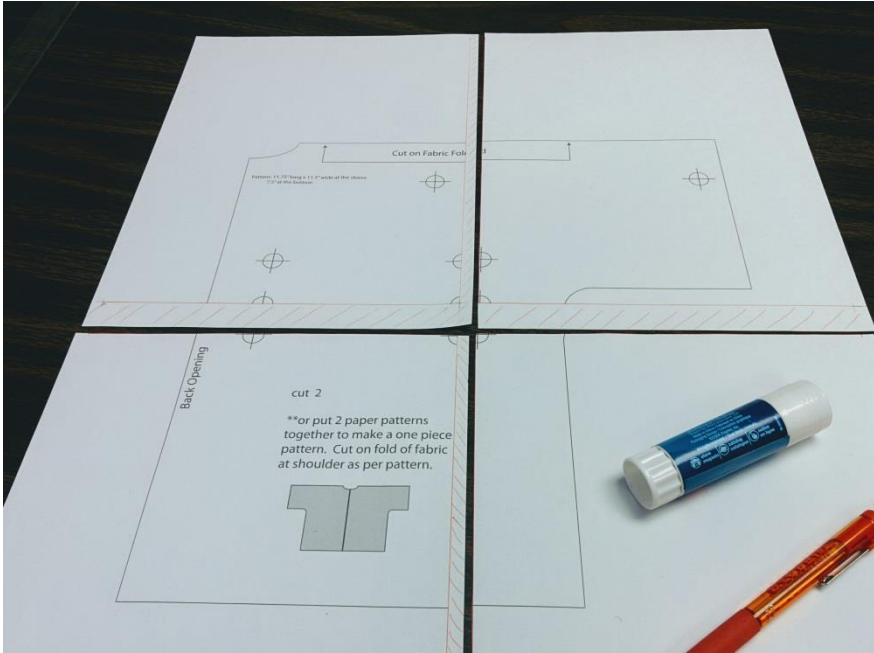
6. Print the pattern. It should come out in 4 sheets of paper.



7. To glue the sheets together, one side of overlap space needs to be trimmed. The cut marks “+” at the corners of each sheet show you the line. (See the red lines in the picture below for an example of where to cut.)



8. Glue the margins (as indicated in orange shades). Tapes work as well.



9. Now the pattern is in a sheet of paper. Cut the outer line to make the pattern. Happy Sewing!
